
## Post-Exposure Prophylaxis (PEP) After Sexual Assault to Prevent an HIV Infection

## Practicalities



28 day therapy of anti-viral medication

You will need blood work done at the time these medications are started and again in about 10 days to see how your body is tolerating them.



Return immediately to the emergency room for vomiting, belly pain, yellow skin or any concerns on how you are tolerating these medications.
